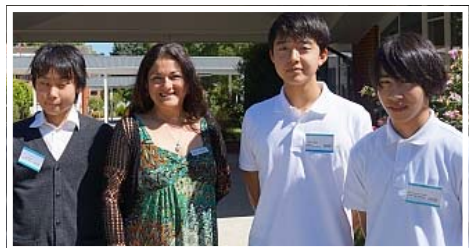

## From Mrs Pascoe

Everyone who becomes a parent thinks that their child is the most important child in the entire world. And you know what...they are! God has gifted us these children to unashamedly love, care for and mould into strong, independent, God-fearing adults. As teachers, we want the same for every child who passes through our door. Teachers also want to see adult versions of these children who will become well adjusted and loving adults.

The first step in achieving this is to ensure that each child is in a safe environment, both at home and at school. Edinburgh College is committed to child safety and are dedicated to ensuring that the seven Child Safety Standards are embedded in all areas of school life and into each classroom.

The seven standards are as follows:

- Standard 1:** Strategies to embed an organisational culture of child safety, through effective leadership arrangements.
- Standard 2:** A Child Safety Policy or statement of commitment to child safety.
- Standard 3:** A Code of Conduct that establishes clear expectations for appropriate behavior with children
- Standard 4:** Screening, supervision, training and other human resource practices that reduce the risk of child abuse by new and existing personnel.
- Standard 5:** Processes for responding to and reporting suspected child abuse.
- Standard 6:** Strategies to identify and reduce or remove risks of child abuse.
- Standard 7:** Strategies to promote the participation and empowerment of children.

Our second step as Christian educators, is to uphold each child and their family to God and to ask for His guidance and protection over each family.

We look forward to working together to love, nurture and educate the children in our care.

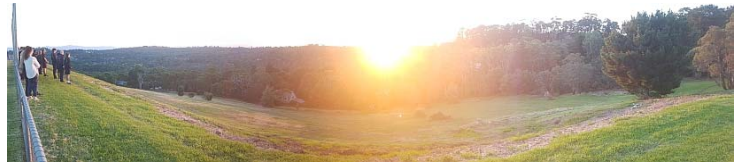
