New Sporting Schools Victoria Membership

Heritage College Primary is now a member of School Sports Victoria (SSV). This gives our middle to upper primary students the opportunity to compete in sports with other children from a range of Independent, Catholic and Government Schools in our local community and state wide.

Our College is in the 'Narre Warren District' and last Thursday our 9 to 13 year olds competed in the District Cross Country.

We took our top 25 long distance runners to test their endurance and grit among the best in our local community. All 9/10 year olds ran 2km and our 11/12 year olds toughed it out over 3km. God blessed us with a perfect autumn day; the sun was shining, skies were blue and there was no wind.

The competition was intense with up to 70 competitors in each race, all vying for a top 10 place. The top 10 finishers in each race have the opportunity to run in the 'Casey South Division' Carnival on Thursday, 1st June.

We can be so proud of each of our competitors. They represented Heritage College with distinction and it was so pleasing to see them displaying our values of Excellence, Respect, Resilience and Service to one another throughout the day.

We witnessed lots of cheering for our students, and indeed, any runners who were really digging deep to get around the course.

In the final wash up of the day we can congratulate each of our participants, but in particular, we had three young ladies who finished in the TOP 10 of their race. Nyagoa M finished 5th in the 12/13 year old race and Serena O finished 5th and Kaitlyn VD finished 8th in the 9/10 year old race. These girls have now qualified to run at Casey Fields on 1st June representing our Division. They have some more training to do within the next three weeks so that they can be in peak form for the competition.

Thank you to the Van Diemen, Saluni and Orellana families for supporting our squad and coming along to cheer Team Heritage. Thank you also to Brooke, Tanisha and Joshua from Year 10 in our secondary school for volunteering a day of their studies to assist as marshals for our course. Without their input and support our team would not be able to compete.


